HR Jazz offers world class jazz performance, artistic, and educational experiences to entertain, inspire, and enrich the cultural landscape of the Hampton Roads region.

Purpose

In 1987 the US House of Representatives voted to approve, with the Senate concurring, that "jazz is hereby designated as a rare and valuable national American treasure." HR Jazz recognizes that jazz brings people together in community. It amplifies and elevates the human experience. Like other fine arts, it does not always attract the commercial support it needs to survive and thrive. Without the nonprofit community and the support of engaged donors and corporate sponsors, the arts would struggle to flourish. HR Jazz, a nonprofit 501(c)3, will provide a sustainable structure with sufficient resources to ensure communities in Hampton Roads experience jazz and reap the benefits that come with bringing jazz to performance and educational settings in our communities.

To support current and future generations of jazz students, it is important to provide educational offerings that connect them to the experience of live jazz and the engagement of jazz artists who will come to Hampton Roads as part of HR Jazz programming. We will seek funding to provide these opportunities to minimize cost to these aspiring students and future jazz artists.

Cultural performances such as those provided by HR Jazz have been shown to yield enormous economic benefits to the communities that host them. Live jazz performances and festivals bring new people and revenues to our communities and benefit other businesses in the community, including the performance venues and the artists themselves. To be viable and affordable, we will seek sponsorships and grant funding to underwrite the costs of providing world class entertainment in comfortable settings throughout Hampton Roads.

Our goal is to provide rich, cultural experiences for all of our community, thus we will ensure that our programs are accessible to those in our community who often cannot afford to experience world class jazz. With generous support from donors and funders, our programs will be affordable and accessible, thus expanding the experience of jazz to all who desire to be in attendance.
